Ohavi Zedek Synagogue will present two exciting performances of “Life in a Jar,” the story of Irena Sendler, a Polish Catholic woman who smuggled 2500 Jewish children past Nazi guards and out of the Warsaw Ghetto, hiding them in convents and orphanages, or arranging for them to be adopted into Polish families. Sendler kept lists of each child’s Jewish name, Polish name and Polish address in glass jars buried beneath an apple tree, in the hope that she could reunite the children with surviving relatives after the war – or at least, return their Jewish identities.

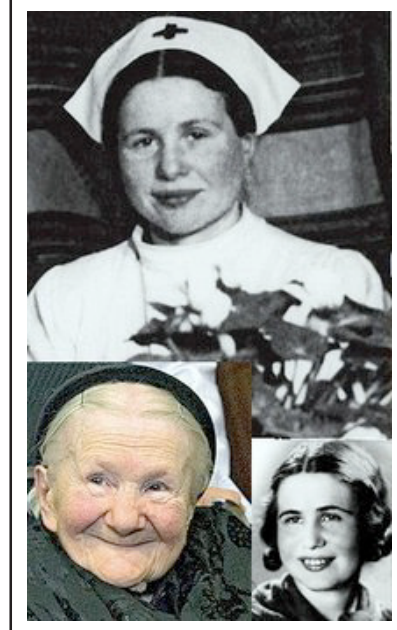
